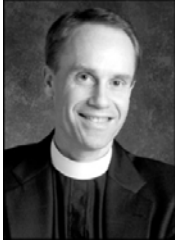

Dear Friends,

Last Tuesday evening the Vestry heard a report from Kristine Miller of Horizons Stewardship Co. regarding the feasibility study that many of you participated in earlier this fall. The purpose of the study was to gauge the congregation's understanding of and support for the ongoing interior restoration. In all, Kristine conducted 33 face-to-face interviews, and then heard from another 105 respondents through the online survey. Some noteworthy findings:

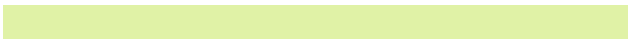
- 78% believe the current restoration project is a faithful response to God's leading for Grace Church.
- 83% believe this current project is an important aspect of Grace Church's mission and ministry.
- 48% would be willing at this time to make a gift to help finish the project, 31% were unsure, and 29% would be unwilling to make a gift.
- 52% believe that most people in the parish are aware of why the restoration is necessary, 41% are unsure, and 7% do not believe people understand the necessity of the project.

Other themes that emerged from the feedback were: A. How another capital campaign would relate to the Bicentennial Campaign of just a few years ago; B. A greater sense of clarity about how much has already been raised through the Bicentennial Campaign, Adopt-A-Pipe, and other sources; C. What is the timeline for future phases of restoration, as even after this phase a large part of the church will remain unrestored.

Above is just a brief snapshot of a very full report that takes into account an analysis of our total parish membership, current giving trends, and demographics of the zip codes we serve. Based on their findings, Horizons Stewardship strongly recommends that we actively address the communication gaps and proceed with a capital campaign in early 2012, with a goal of funding as much of the current project as possible without having to borrow any more than necessary from the endowment. I am pleased to say that the Vestry accepted the report, and after a thorough round of questioning, voted unanimously to proceed with the recommendations therein. Much more detail to come, so stay tuned.

Finally, the Sunday Forum promises to be a real treat this week. Read below and make plans to attend. See you in church.

SUNDAY NOVEMBER 13

SUNDAY FORUM 10 AM - CONSTRUCTING THE INEFFABLE with Karla Britton, PhD., Lecturer, Yale School of Architecture. Throughout the history of architecture there has been no more significant endeavor than the construction of houses of worship, which were once the focal point around which civilizations and city-states developed. In her recently published book, *Constructing the Ineffable*, architectural historian Karla Britton describes how sacred buildings are viewed in contemporary architecture and religious practice. Using visual examples of recent sacred architecture, Britton will examine how we define and understand sacred space, focusing on the role that design and construction play in religious buildings. *Today's presentation is part of our fall Sunday Forum series, "The Church and the City," which is looking at how the church manifests itself in the city both physically and metaphorically. Each presentation will include time for questions and answers and takes place in Tuttle Hall with coffee and refreshments.*

NOV 20 - GRACE CHURCH SCHOOL SUNDAY The purpose of the day is to uphold and celebrate the common history, ministry, and mission of Grace Church and Grace Church School. At the 10 am Sunday Forum George Davison, Head of GCS, and Hugo Mahibir, Head of the soon-to-open GCS High School division will speak about the new project.
