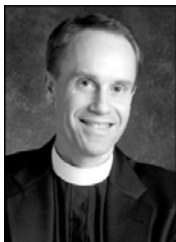

What a week it has been for our Novice and Junior Choristers. All week long these 3rd, 4th, and 5th graders have been working extremely hard with Dr. Allen, and guest conductor Dr. Barry Rose. In the 1980's Dr. Rose was Organist & Choirmaster of St. Paul's Cathedral, London (yes, that's the building with the big dome that dominates the London skyline). It was there that he conducted the choir for services that were seen by millions across the globe - including the wedding of Prince Charles and Lady Diana Spencer. ### SUNDAY JANUARY 29

**WE WELCOME DR. BARRY ROSE** as guest conductor of the choir at 11 am. Dr. Rose is an old friend to Grace Church and has been working with the Choirs all week. This afternoon at 4 pm he will conduct our Novice and Junior Boy and Girl Choristers for the Fourth Annual Concert of Music for Treble Voices and the Whiting of Novices.

**THE SUNDAY FORUM 10 AM** - "Christian-Muslim Engagement in Positive Terms" is a two-part series led by Dr. Lucinda Mosher ([www.lucindamosher.net](http://www.lucindamosher.net)), Faculty Associate in Interfaith Studies at Hartford Seminary with Dr. Hussein Rashid ([www.husseinrashid.com](http://www.husseinrashid.com)), Professor of Religious Studies, Hofstra University. ## COMING SOON

### **FEB 5, 12, 19 - THE SUNDAY FORUM 10 AM - THE MEANING OF THE LORD'S PRAYER**

presented in a three-part lecture series led by The Rev. Dr. Robert J. Owens, Professor of Old Testament at the General Theological Seminary. The simple little prayer that is usually called the Lord's Prayer (the "Our Father") has been loved and recited by Christians from the first century in both private devotion and corporate worship. According to Matthew and Luke it was taught by Jesus himself, and Anglicans know it from the Book of Common Prayer as an element both in Morning and Evening Prayer and in the liturgy of Eucharist. From the Middle Ages onward, the Lord's Prayer has been one of the core features of Christian catechisms, used to teach new Christians the basics of the Faith. Our class will look at, among other things, the two different ways Jesus teaches the prayer in the Gospels of Matthew and Luke, and we will study its individual phrases, to show the great themes of faith and human existence that each suggests.

**FEB 5 - THE ANNUAL PARISH MEETING** will be held in Tuttle Hall on Sunday, Feb. 5 immediately following the 11 am service. Reports will be given by the Nominating Committee, the Treasurer, the Head of Grace Church School, the Senior Warden, and the Rector. A delicious lunch (\$5 per person suggested donation) will be served. A pizza lunch will be provided for children in the Nursery while the meeting takes place.

**FEB 6 - OUTREACH MONDAY MEETING & POTLUCK SUPPER** One Monday each month (generally the first), the Outreach Committee seeks to build a community of people concerned about serving the poor in New York City and beyond.
