



The Second Sunday after the Epiphany



Dear Friends,

Those of you who pay attention to the news may have noticed that the planet Mars is much in the headlines.

Specifically, a plan is afoot by a privately funded corporation called Mars One to land the first humans on the Red Planet in

2024 - just ten years from now. The only drawback? It's a one-way ticket. The first astronauts who go to Mars in the effort to colonize and tame it will live out the remainder of their lives and die there. They cannot return. Nevertheless, 200,000 people recently submitted applications to be among the first four to go, and after an initial screening the list is now down to approximately 1,000.

Yesterday's news reported that one of the thousand finalists turns out to be a man named Ken Sullivan, who is a 38-year old pilot. The problem is, Sullivan never consulted his wife about the project. The couple has four children together, the youngest of whom is 6-months old. Sullivan's wife is understandably miffed that her husband would want to pursue an otherworldly dream that leaves her and their family behind forever. In her mind it is an unholy and unrealistic dream. "Do we get divorced now, or get divorced later?" she asks.

This weekend the nation will pause to remember someone else with a dream: the Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. In August of 1963 King stood on the steps of the Lincoln Memorial and spoke to the 200,000 people who had participated in the march on Washington. In his speech King explained his dream that one day this

nation would rise up and live out the true meaning of its creed: "We hold these truths to be self-evident, that all men are created equal." He dreamed that one day his four little children would live in a nation where they would be judged not by the color of their skin, but by the content of their character.

Was King's dream otherworldly? Yes and no. Yes, in that he drew on the Spirit of God and the Biblical prophets for his vision. No, in that his intention was to strive for a just society in the here and now, not someplace far away and sometime far off in the future. Was his dream holy? Without a doubt. Was it realistic? Well, that's up to you and me and every succeeding generation, isn't it? The dream is ours to pursue. I'm not suggesting that we shouldn't go to Mars, but it seems to me that we have lots of work still to do here, lest we wind up taking the same old ills of human society to yet another world.

I hope you'll spend some time this weekend considering how you can make the world a better place in the here and now. Perhaps you might begin by reading Dr. King's famous speech, which you can find by clicking [here](#).

JAN 26 – 10 AM – THE WHOLE CHRIST: ST. AUGUSTINE AND THE THEOLOGY OF PRISON MINISTRY – THE SUNDAY FORUM, Human Suffering: Compassion in Action series. Steven Y. Lee, General Theological Seminary, M.Div. 2014. Ministering to prison inmates requires compassion, pastoral

presence and programmatic dedication. But the mitigation of human suffering in the prison context does not fully explain or justify the church's involvement in such a setting. The question the church must answer is as follows: "What are the theological implications of prison ministry?" Using ideas first developed by St. Augustine, this class will examine how prison ministry can shed light on what it means to be a member of a church community. Steven Y. Lee, seminarian at General Theological Seminary, has taught New Testament and Contemporary Theology classes at Fishkill Correctional Facility in Beacon, N.Y. and at Sing-Sing Correctional Facility in Ossining, N.Y.

JAN 26 – 4 PM – SIXTH ANNUAL CONCERT OF MUSIC FOR TREBLE VOICES by The Junior Choristers of the Grace Church Choirs under the direction of [Dr. Barry Rose, OBE](#). Compositions will include those by Malcolm Archer, J.S.
