

Dear Friends,

It may be a statement of the obvious, but if you look below at the schedule for this coming Sunday's worship services, you will notice that much is new. First, the Rev. Martha Korienek will preach her first sermon as Associate Rector of Grace Church at

the 9 and 11 am services. Months ago when I made out the preaching ROTA we had yet to fill the position. In fact, Martha's name had not even entered the conversation. But I went on faith that by the third Sunday in September our new Associate Rector would be in place, and that in the natural flow of things the time would be right for this person to climb the pulpit steps and put in a good word for Jesus. Little did I know then that Jesus himself was not going to make it easy for Martha. The Gospel passage appointed for Sunday happens to be the most difficult parable that Jesus ever told: the Parable of the Dishonest Manager (Luke 16:1-13). Good luck, Martha! 
