

Dear Friends,

Well, it has been a week unlike any other. Of course, every presidential election produces a winner and a loser, with the euphoria or devastation that follows in the people who aligned themselves with a


particular candidate. This time around it was different. Whether you are happy, sad, or somewhere in between about the election's result, the one common reaction that seems to be true in people from coast to coast is surprise, if not shock. On Tuesday morning, all the latest polls pointed to what would be a Clinton victory. By early Wednesday morning it was clear that the pollsters had missed a vast segment of the population who rose up and chose Trump. 
