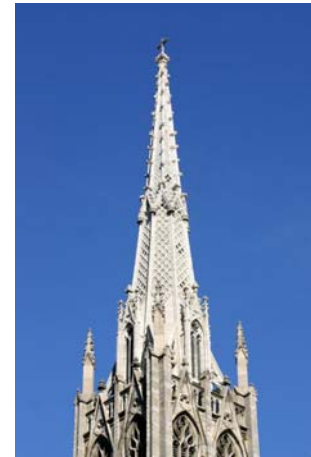

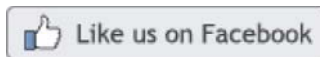

The Third Sunday after the Epiphany



Dear Friends,

It is Friday morning as I write this, and in just over an hour the ceremonies surrounding the inauguration of the 45th President of the United States will begin. Donald J. Trump is unlike any of his

predecessors in temperament and background, and his assuming the reigns of the most powerful office in the land is cause for tremendous anxiety not just among coastal and urban dwellers in this country, but in governments throughout the world. No one quite knows what to expect, though many are quick to offer their predictions.

In the past months since the election President Obama has reminded us repeatedly that one of the hallmarks of our democracy is the peaceful transfer of power. Coincidentally, among the headlines in the news this morning is the tiny African nation of Gambia. In December the leader of Gambia, a man named Yahya Jammeh who seized power 22 years ago in a coup, lost in the presidential election. Unfortunately, Jammeh is now refusing to cede power to the democratically elected president, Adama Barrow. People are fleeing the capital. Neighboring countries are threatening to intervene. In fact, Barrow was inaugurated yesterday in Senegal, a country that completely surrounds Gambia, and the Senegalese army may resort to removing Jammeh by force. Anxious times indeed.



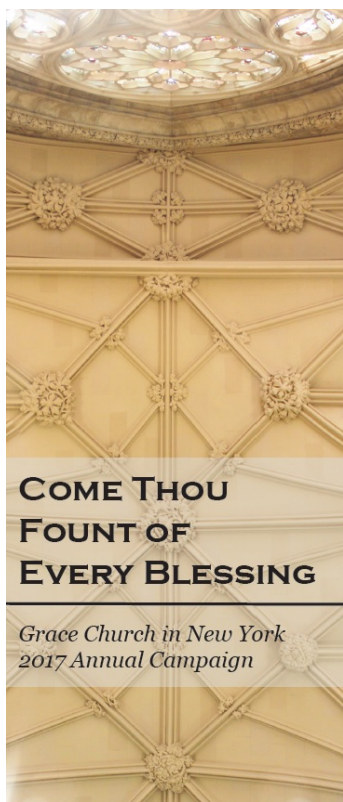

JAN 28 – CITY-WIDE 20'S AND 30'S REFLECTION DAY WITH BISHOP GLASSPOOL –20's and 30's Episcopalians and friends from around the diocese are invited to join the Rt. Rev. Mary Glasspool for "Where Grace Meets Power," a day of storytelling, scripture, and discussion of mission and ministry to the world in the face of power, authority, and empire. JAN 29 – DEACONESSES: GRACE CHURCH & THE ASCENT OF FEMALE MINISTRY– THE SUNDAY FORUM @10AM. The Episcopal Church instituted deaconesses in the late nineteenth century as a way of returning to the role women had in the early church and expanding the role that women had in the life of the church. Many of the early deaconesses came from Grace Church, and we will examine their lives and ministries and how they prepared the way for women being ordained priests. *Led by Nicholas Birns, Ph.D., Associate Professor of Literature at NYU School of Professional Studies.*

FEB 5 – (PART I) COULD THE TEXT OF THE GOSPEL HAVE BEEN CHANGED BY EARLY EDITORS AND SCRIBES? – THE SUNDAY FORUM @10AM. Most Christians are not aware the autographs of our Biblical books have not survived. So what happened to the text in between the books' composition, and the earliest manuscripts we have access to? In this lecture, Elizabeth Schrader gives an introduction to the many different manuscripts and manuscript variations of the New Testament. *Elizabeth 'Libbie' Schrader is a recent graduate of General Theological Seminary. In September, Libbie's M.A. thesis 'Was Martha of Bethany Added to the Fourth Gospel in the Second Century?' was published by the Harvard Theological Review." Part II of this talk takes place next week.*

In part II of her talk begun last week, Libbie Schrader shows us the troubling manuscript variations around Martha in the Fourth Gospel, and based on the oldest manuscript that exists of John 11, she argues that Martha was not present in the earliest circulating version of the text. Would Martha's absence in the Fourth Gospel provide us with new information about the identity of Mary Magdalene?"
